We invite you to join God's people around the world in celebrating the quarterly Day of Prayer. No matter how great your challenges may be, our God is greater!

In a year filled with loss and grief, He offers hope beyond our imagination: "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Heb. 4:16).

In a world of constant uncertainty, He promises answers: "Call to Me, and I will answer you, and show you great and mighty things, which you do not know" (Jer. 33:3).

And to believers who regret the past or fear the future, He issues an open invitation: "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest" (Matt. 11:28).

Not one prayer escapes the notice of our loving heavenly Father, who waits eagerly to pour out blessings when His people ask. Please join us by gathering your church members, friends, and neighbors to seek God's wisdom and claim His endless promises!

Our 2022 Theme: Praying the Three Angels' Messages

This year our quarterly Day of Prayer guides will focus on praying through the timely three angels' messages of Revelation 14:6-12. Praying through Scripture gives substance to our prayers and allows God to speak directly through His Word.

You probably already know that the three angels' messages make up a vital part of Seventh-day Adventist identity. You may have memorized these verses. And yet a surprising number of Adventists cannot explain why these messages matter. Where do the three angels fit in the big picture of salvation? What do they say about God's love? How do they affect my life, and how can I share them with the world?

While the Day of Prayer guides are not intended as a theological study, we hope they lead you to pray with purpose and seek a deeper understanding of God's precious final messages to the world.

Invite Everyone—Young and Old

You may notice a change from previous years: these activities are designed especially for intergenerational groups. We want to inspire everyone to pray together: children and parents, teens and retirees, singles and couples, lifelong Christians and curious seekers. Please adapt the materials to suit your own group.

Many of the prayer activities will be more meaningful with children and youth present. Be sure to invite them to share their joy and talents during your Day of Prayer.

Suggestions for Day of Prayer Leaders

- The first Sabbath of each quarter is designated as the Day of Prayer. These materials could also be adapted for other prayer events or even youth groups.
- This year's Day of Prayer activities are designed for multiple generations praying together. Be intentional about inviting people of all ages. Ask children, youth, grandparents, single adults, and others to help lead activities.
- If you wish, begin prayer sessions with group singing or other music that is meaningful to your congregation and culture. Since this year's Day of Prayer is intended for multiple generations, consider including favorite songs for all ages. Ask young people or families to help choose and lead the music.
- Encourage participants to pray brief prayers so everyone can join in.
- This Day of Prayer guide includes suggested activities for five sessions:
 Session 1: Friday morning worship at church school or a youth meeting or other event.
 Session 2: Friday night family worship. (Families come in all shapes and sizes. If you are a family of one, consider inviting friends or neighbors to your home, or gather outdoors.)
 Session 3: Sabbath morning personal devotions. (Guard this time alone with Jesus. If you have young children, enjoy doing these activities together.)
 Session 4: Sabbath morning worship service at church.
 Session 5: Sabbath afternoon prayer service at church or another location.
- **Optional:** You may wish to hold an extended prayer session for adults and teens after Session 5 on Sabbath afternoon. See the United Prayer Guide for suggestions.

Basic Planning Checklist

- Talk to your pastor and church board well in advance and put the quarterly Day of Prayer on the church calendar for the first Sabbath of each quarter.
- Beginning several weeks in advance, announce Day of Prayer activities in church and in the bulletin. Let people know that this year's activities are designed especially for multiple ages.
- Encourage church members to invite community friends to join in Day of Prayer activities. God's timely messages of love are meant for all!
- Print the Church Handout and distribute several weeks in advance. The handout can also be distributed during the Day of Prayer to anyone who has not received it yet.
- Print activity sheets for Session 1, Session 4, and Session 5. Delegate a leader for each session.
- Print activity sheets for Session 2 and Session 3 and distribute copies to Day of Prayer participants one or two weeks in advance. Use the church bulletin or announcement time to briefly describe the Friday evening worship (Session 2) and Sabbath morning personal devotions (Session 3). Encourage members of all ages to join in. Send electronic reminders if possible.
- Print the United Prayer Guide and delegate a leader if you plan to hold a longer united prayer session after the group activities on Sabbath afternoon.
- Session leaders should read through activity sheets, gather any needed materials, find extra volunteers or music leaders if needed, and pray for the Holy Spirit to lead.
- Print other Day of Prayer materials as needed: Welcome and Planning Suggestions (for leaders) Prayer Promises (optional handout for participants)

You're Invited: Join Us for *Quarterly Days of Prayer* in 2022!

You're invited to join believers worldwide for a special Day of Prayer on the first Sabbath of each quarter.

- This year we're praying through the timely three angels' messages of Revelation 14.
- If your church is already celebrating the quarterly Day of Prayer, plan to attend and invite your friends. Otherwise, talk to your pastor or church board about participating in Day of Prayer this year. You can also participate as a family, in a small group, or on your own.

- These prayer activities are designed especially for multigenerational groups. We want to inspire everyone to pray together: children and parents, teens and retirees, singles and couples, lifelong Christians and curious seekers. If you've never attended prayer events before, this is your chance!

No matter how great your challenges may be, our God is greater. In a year filled with loss and grief, He offers hope beyond imagination: "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need" (Heb. 4:16). Let's pray together this year!

Why Pray Through the Three Angels' Messages?

You may have memorized the three angels' messages of Revelation 14:6-12. These are God's last messages of love to the world, and yet a surprising number of Christians cannot explain why these verses matter.

- Where do the three angels' messages fit in the big picture of salvation?
- What do they say about God's love?
- How do they affect my life and how can I share them with the world?

Praying through Scripture gives substance to our prayers and allows God to speak directly through His Word. We hope the 2022 quarterly Days of Prayer will lead you to pray with purpose and inspire you to study His precious prophetic messages more deeply.

So What Do the Messages Actually Say?

First, read Revelation 14:6-12 from a solid Bible translation. You may be confused at first because layers of meaning hide beneath the surface. How do you break the code? Start by prayerfully studying the entire Bible because it contains everything you need to understand the book of Revelation. Ask your pastor to offer a Revelation seminar or recommend good study materials that allow the Bible to interpret itself. Here's an extremely simplified summary to get you started:

Angel 1: Worship Jesus as our Savior and Creator in this time of judgment.

Angel 2: Follow Jesus through His written Word and do not be deceived.

Angel 3: You have a choice: follow Christ or Satan. Have faith in Christ as your Righteousness!

Time: Friday morning worship at church school or a youth meeting or other event

Theme: Praying to the trustworthy God

Connect

- Give each person a small piece of paper and a pen or pencil.
- Ask everyone to write one positive truth about themselves that no one in the group is likely to know. Examples: *I'm pretty good at rock climbing*. Or *I've lived in three different countries*.
- Collect the papers and read them aloud, inviting everyone to guess who wrote each statement. After a few guesses, ask the correct person to stand.
- Explain: We can always learn more about a person, even our closest friends and family. Jesus wants us to know HIM more. He doesn't want us to be confused about His loving character and His amazing love!

Discover

- Read Genesis 11:1-9 together.
- Ask: What does this story tell us about God's interest in what people are doing? What does it tell us about His power?
- Discuss: What does *Babel* mean? ("confusion")
- Ask: What confusing ideas were the builders of the Tower of Babel introducing? Ellen G. White in the book *Patriarchs and Prophets* (p. 119) gives the following insights. Briefly read or paraphrase her points (or ask older students to read p. 119 in the book and suggest key ideas).
 - "The dwellers on the plain of Shinar disbelieved God's covenant that He would not again bring a flood upon the earth."
 - "Many of them denied the existence of God and attributed the Flood to the operation of natural causes."
 - "One object before them in the erection of the tower was to secure their own safety in case of another deluge. By carrying the structure to a much greater height than was reached by the waters of the flood, they thought to place themselves beyond all possibility of danger."
 - "The whole undertaking was designed to exalt still further the pride of its projectors and to turn the minds of future generations away from God and lead them into idolatry."
- Sing a song about how amazing God is.

Pray

- Thank God that He is a God of certainty, not confusion.
- Thank God for how He brings order to your life.
- Sing one stanza of a song about how you can trust God.

Live

- Form teams of two or three. Share with each other one way you want God to take confusion out of your life. Pray for each other's specific needs.
- Sing one stanza of a song about how God is always with us.

Time: Friday night family worship or worship with friends in a home or outdoors

Theme: God never fails!

Connect

- Sit with your family or group in a circle. •
- Invite everyone to think of a law in nature that you have never seen broken. Then each person briefly acts out one law of nature that never changes. Very young children may need a partner. Example: Pick up an object and let it drop. Object falls DOWN, not UP.
- Invite everyone to guess which natural law is being acted out. ٠
- Explain: Humans create many things that appear unbreakable (monuments, machines, etc.), but all human creations eventually break or fall apart. Only God never fails or changes.
- History tells about a man who created a city and a nation that he thought would last forever. He found out that only God never fails.

Discover

- Read Daniel 4:29-33 together. •
- Ask: What did King Nebuchadnezzar think about himself and his great city of Babylon? What did • God say? And what was the result of his pride?
- Read Daniel 4:34-37 together.
- Summarize together: What was Nebuchadnezzar's testimony after he humbled himself? •

Pray

Keep your Bibles open to Daniel 4:34-37. Praise God for the characteristics described in each verse. Examples from Daniel 4:34: You are the Most High God. No one on earth is higher than You! You live forever, God. You will never die!

Live

Talk about how you can practice praising God daily for His divine character. You might start a new family tradition of praising God for something special during morning or evening worship. Take your inspiration from the words of Scripture or God's blessings in your daily life. Examples:

God the Father, You rule over everything! God the Son, You never change! God the Holy Spirit, You are mighty and loving!

Time: Sabbath morning personal/family devotions

Theme: Look to God, not man

Connect

- Ask: Can you think of a time when something man-made failed you? If you are having worship with children, ask them to draw a picture of something created by humans that didn't work correctly. Guess what the picture depicts. Example: *a drawing of a new toy that broke quickly.*
- Let's discover truths about God and why we can depend on Him always.

Discover

- Read Revelation 14:8 together. The second angel declares that Babylon has fallen. Think about how God's character contrasts with that of Babylon—and how His kingdom will never fail or fall apart.
- Look up these verses to explore more of God's character and why He can be trusted all the time:
 - o Isaiah 40:28
 - Psalm 90:2
 - o Psalm 106:2
 - o Romans 1:20

Pray

• Read the passages above one more time. Praise God for what you discover about Him in each text. Example: *Lord, most things in this world are temporary. Thank You that You are everlasting!*

Live

• Continue making praise a regular part of your personal devotions. Practice praising God for something specific every day.

Examples:

God, You are the Giver of all good gifts. You are the First and the Last. You are the Creator of heaven and earth.

Time: Sabbath morning worship service

Theme: Man's "forever" never matches up to God's "forever"

Planning suggestions:

Coordinate the church service with your pastor or elders. Include essential items from your usual order of service, such as welcome and offering. Note that Scripture readings, songs, and a multigenerational activity are included as part of this suggested service. Pray about how you can make the program special and include all ages in worship. Also remember to invite everyone to the afternoon prayer program, and encourage members to bring friends.

Before the Day of Prayer, arrange for volunteers to help by reading Scripture passages aloud. Also prepare the "Timeless Truths About Jesus" listed in the Discover section below. Consider writing these on large posters (perhaps children or youth can help you write and decorate the posters). If this is impossible, list the truths on a large whiteboard for all to read. **This church service can be "hosted" by a leader who remains up front to ask the discussion questions, briefly explain passages, give directions, and announce songs. Young people or other volunteers may sit on the front row or beside the leader so they are ready to read Scripture passages, lead music, or help in other ways.**

Sing

- Sing a hymn of praise for our mighty God.
- Sing a children's song about God's power and might.

Pray

- Ask everyone to form groups of three or four. Choose some helpers ahead of time to pair up with people sitting alone and make sure everyone has a group.
- Ask everyone to pray brief prayers of thanksgiving with their groups. Thank God for specific examples of His power in your life.

Connect

- Ask everyone to remain in their groups of three or four. Share in your groups about an event in your life that seemed like it would last "forever."
- Explain: Some things in life seem like they will go on forever, but the Bible tells us that everything in this world will come to an end. Today we're taking a fresh look at the second angel's message of Revelation 14:8. Here we read that Babylon is fallen. Why does this message matter?
- Explain: A long time ago there was a king who thought his kingdom would last forever. Instead, he discovered the truth of a mighty God who lasts forever while earthly kingdoms fall. Ready to discover this truth all over again?

Discover

- Read aloud: Daniel 5:1-5. (King Belshazzar praises false gods made by man.) (Consider assigning a different church member to read each Scripture passage during the service.)
- Ask: What things in this world are receiving your attention and praise?
- Invite everyone to pray silently: Offer brief prayers of confession about the worldly things that have distracted you from the true God who lives forever.

- Read aloud: Daniel 5:5-9. (God sends the king a message that no one can explain.)
- Read aloud: Daniel 5:22-28. (God sends Daniel to explain the message.)
- Explain: Babylon has always been full of falsehoods and confusion when it comes to truth. Here are some truths about Jesus that spiritual Babylon is trying to confuse in our day. (Leader can read each of the following posters aloud. If time allows, have volunteers read the complete Bible passages.)

Timeless Truths About Jesus

(Write these on posters for children to hold up, or display by another method)

- Jesus is the only name by which we may be saved. Acts 4:10-12
- Jesus is our High Priest who stands up FOR us now in this time of judgment. Hebrews 3:1 and 9:24
- Jesus is as changeless as His law. Hebrews 13:8 and Matthew 5:18
- Jesus is the Lord of the Sabbath. Mark 2:27, 28
- Jesus has a people who keep His commandments and hold to true prophets. Revelation 12:17 and 19:10
- Jesus awakens the righteous dead when He returns.
 1 Thessalonians 4:16-18
- Jesus is literally coming again! Revelation 1:7

Pray

- Thank God for each of these truths about Jesus.
- Also confess the times when God's people have followed what appeared to be truth but was really a temporary human solution.
- Ask God for wisdom to know what is temporary and what lasts forever. Thank Him that He WILL give wisdom to those who ask (James 1:5).

Live

- Form groups of three or four again.
- Discuss: Which of these seven truths about Jesus do you most need to study and practice this coming week? Share your answers with each other and pray for wisdom and faithfulness.

Sing

• Sing a song about the truth of Jesus.

Pray

• Close by asking the Holy Spirit to lead children, youth, and adults to live out the everlasting truth of Jesus.

Time: Sabbath afternoon prayer program

Theme: Join what is standing—not what is falling!

Connect

- Form groups of two or three. Make sure everyone is part of a group.
- Discuss in groups: What was the most difficult place to leave in your entire life? Why?
- Leader: Explain that even "hard" places can become difficult to leave.
- Invest your life in what will stand the test of time—even if that means leaving a place where you feel temporarily comfortable.

Discover

- Read aloud: Revelation 14:8 and 18:5.
- Read aloud: *The Great Controversy*, pp. 389, 390.
 - Here Ellen White explains that the fall of Babylon will not be complete until:
 - Babylon has made "ALL NATIONS drink of the wine of the wrath of her fornication" (Rev. 14:8).
 - Satan works "with all power and signs and lying wonders and with all deceivableness of unrighteousness" (2 Thess. 2:9, 10).
 - They that "received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved" will be left to receive "strong delusion, that they should believe a lie" (2 Thess. 2:10, 11).
 - The church described in Revelation 14:8 rejects the warning of the three angels' messages.
- Read aloud: "Not until this condition shall be reached, and the union of the church with the world shall be fully accomplished throughout Christendom, will the fall of Babylon be complete" (Ellen G. White, *The Great Controversy*, p. 390).
- Contrast fallen Babylon with God's kingdom as described in Isaiah 40:8 and Hebrews 13:8.
- Invite everyone to draw a picture showing one way God has been faithful to you in past years.
- Hang all the pictures up for everyone to see. (One way to hang the pictures: hang up a rope like a clothesline and hang pictures with clothespins.)

Pray

- Leader or volunteer: Thank God for warning us about the fall of Babylon and for calling His people out of Babylon.
- Sing together: Any song of thanksgiving. (Make an easy transition from prayers to songs by singing a cappella or with a convenient instrument such as a guitar.)
- Leader or volunteer: Praise God that both He and His Word last forever.
- Sing together: Any song about God's Word.
- Leader: Invite participants to silently confess any compromise in their lives.
- Sing together: Any song about the cleansing power of Jesus.
- Leader: Ask God for courage to stand tall for Christ.

Sing

• Sing a song of standing up for Jesus.

Live

• Give everyone a small blank card. Ask everyone to draw a simple figure of themselves "standing tall for Jesus." Then under the picture write one way God is calling you to stand tall for Him right now. Keep the card in your Bible.

Pray

- We know that everything people trust in this old world will soon fail: friends, businesses, governments, and bank accounts may be here today and gone tomorrow.
- Thank Jesus that He will never fail!

Optional Activity for Children or Youth:

• Provide pieces of paper and colorful art supplies so each young person can draw a large picture of themselves standing tall for Jesus. Label each picture "Stand Up for Jesus!" Hang the pictures in a hallway or the church entry.

United Prayer Guide

One goal of this year's quarterly Day of Prayer sessions is to call a new generation to prayer. That's why the activities focus on bringing together all ages to seek God while exploring the practical truths of the three angels' messages. Let's mentor the young, encourage the lonely, and affirm the seekers among us. Everyone is invited!

We also encourage making time for a deeper united prayer time, especially for adults and teens. Consider adding an extended group prayer time after the multigenerational activities on Sabbath afternoon (Session 5). Other possible times for extended prayer include Friday evening or Sabbath morning before Sabbath School.

Possible Outline for a United Prayer Session

Singing: Begin with a song of praise. Feel free to mingle songs throughout the prayer time.

Thanks and Praise: Give thanks for specific blessings and praise God for His goodness.

Confession: Take a few minutes for private confession and thank God for His forgiveness.

Guidance: Ask God to grant wisdom for current challenges and decisions.

Our Church: Ask God to bless the efforts of our local, regional, and world church.

Local Requests: Pray for current needs of church members, family, and neighbors.

Listen and Respond: Take time to listen for God's voice and respond in praise or song.

Praying Scripture: In addition to bringing God your requests, make time to pray the words of Scripture. Claim God's promises and respond with praise and thanks. Your group may wish to pray through the three angels' messages, asking God for deeper understanding and wisdom for sharing truth with the world. Another option is to pray together through psalms of praise.

Optional Meal: Some churches conclude the Day of Prayer with a simple evening meal in celebration of God's blessings.
